The bay is fully exposed to the open sea and the frequently occurring strong winds that plummet from the summits of the Allardyce Range (up to 2000m high). The 3km long fine dark sanded beach only gets inter-rupted by some rivers flowing from the Heaney, Buxton and Cook Glaciers.
